5 min.	<p>Overview of the Adult Child Interactive Reading Inventory (ACIRI). The following are key points to mention:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Focuses on interactive reading • Interactive reading is when you read aloud with your child. You and your child read together. You talk about the book, the pictures, and the words. You take turns when reading and holding the book. You talk about how it connects to your personal life. It is fun and stress free. No one person is in charge. You learn from each other as you read. • Interactive reading is scientifically based. It is proven to help children develop important and necessary skills to become good readers and will help them be more successful in school. 	None
5 min.	<p>Explain the importance of the ACIRI and how it will be conducted. The following demonstrates some wording and examples of how you can do this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will work on techniques to help your child develop skills to become strong readers. Every week we will introduce a new technique and you will have a chance to practice them and then you can use them at home with your child. • To help show changes and growth, we will be using the ACIRI to observe you and your child reading together, once in the beginning and once at the end of the program. <p><i>Note... on page 28 of <u>Let's Read Together</u>, you will find a 'non-threatening' script of how you can introduce the observation on the day that you will be administering it.</i></p>	None
