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GEER grants

- Must submit invoice to get money
 - Not itemized; not on reimbursement basis
- Email dated 12/21
- Actual use of funds should align with proposed items
 - Flexibility among items in budget
 - Inform advisor of changes
 - Adding or removing proposed items; need to ensure any new items are allowable
 - Significant increase/decrease in amount expended on proposed items



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Compulsory school age

- Info on PDE website
- Effective July 1, 2020: 6-18 years old
- · Does not apply retroactively
 - Drop out at age 17 prior to July 1, 2020 is not required to re-enroll
- Person who dropped out at age 17 prior to July 1, 2020, is eligible for adult education because "not required to be enrolled"



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Documentation for 16 and 17 year olds

- 16: evidence of approval from district superintendent
- 17 and withdrew after 7/1/2020: documentation from school
- 17 and withdrew prior to 7/1/2020
 - Preference: Documentation from school
 - 2nd choice: Statement from parents/guardian that the child is withdrew prior to 7/1/2020
 - 3rd choice: Self-attestation
