

UNDERSTAND THE PATHWAY

- Identify entry requirements (educational, physical, geographical, and financial) with PA CareerLink[®] partner staff.
- Coordinate with PA CareerLink® Business **Service Team** to determine which sponsors may be willing to review materials and curriculum being used to prepare adults for apprenticeship pathway.
- Ask PA CareerLink[®] staff to share career pathway options that are available after completion of the apprenticeship.


ALIGN INSTRUCTION AND SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

- Create **contextualized lessons** OR **classes** that align to the literacy and workforce preparation skills needs for entrance into and successful transition through the apprenticeship program.
- Explore how co-enrollment in WIOA programs can offer funding and other supports (transportation, testing fees, work supplies, etc.) for adult learners to enter and persist in apprenticeship pathways.

- Launch a career that has advancement opportunities.
- Possibly attain college credits through 2- and 4-year institutions and create opportunities for future degrees.
