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Moving beyond "COVID crisis"

- "COVID period" March-June 2020
- PY 2020-21: beginning of new normal
 - Incorporates activities put in place because of the pandemic and related shut down
 - Additions to policies, guidelines, and eData to reflect the new normal



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Policy D.130 Distance learning

- What programs are required and allowed to do
- Defines the types of distance learning
- Lists the approved distance learning curricula
- Purpose and role of Statewide DLP
- Defines “participant in distance education” for federal reporting



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Distance learning definition

- NRS: a formal learning activity in which the students and instructors are separated by geography, time, or both
- NOT
 - Computer-based learning during in-person classroom instruction
 - Homework



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Types of distance learning

- Computer-based or technology enhanced
 - Real-time remote instruction
 - Supplemental distance learning
 - Teacher-assigned non-supplemental (should be very limited)
- Paper-based
 - NRS reportable
 - Can be either supplemental DL (preferred) or teacher-assigned non-supplemental (limited)



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Required

- Blended learning
 - Real-time instruction + supplemental distance learning
 - Supplemental DL activities are tied to and enhance the content of real-time instruction
 - Computer-based or paper-based
 - From resources listed in Policy D.100
 - Required for 064
 - Strongly encouraged for 054 and 061

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Real time instruction

- Teacher and students are together at the same time; live, not recorded
 - In-person: teacher and students in the same physical location at the same time
 - Remote: teacher and students are physically separated by geography but together in time using technology
 - Includes phone, webinar, etc.
 - Must allow for real time live communication

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Remote ≠ distance learning

- “Remote” and “distance learning” are not synonymous
 - Remote is used only for “real-time remote instruction” to differentiate it from “real-time in-person instruction”

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In summary

- All students must participate in real-time instruction
- 064 grantees must provide supplemental distance learning to students
- Programs may provide teacher-assigned non-supplemental also
- Supplemental DL must not replace real time instruction
- Teacher-assigned non-supplemental DL must not replace supplemental DL



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Request for clarification

- What is “hybrid”? Is it a class that is taught in person and remotely at the same time? Or a class that is taught remotely some days and in-person other days?
 - Not defined in D.130
 - Way to enter a class in the grant application



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Data collection: Why?

- Federal reporting: we report on the subset of participants that do distance learning
 - Tables 4c: Measurable Skill Gains and Attendance by Entry Level for Participants in Distance Education
 - Table 5a: Outcome Achievement for Participants in Distance Education
 - PA reports participants receiving a minimum of 12 hours of distance learning



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▶ Planning for data collection and entry

- Review with all staff how your agency is doing distance learning
- Develop processes and procedures required for ensuring standardized data collection
- Determine how your agency is going to enter DL data in compliance with Division policy and guidance
