- Summer 2018 Requirement to offer online SDL
- Summer 2019
 - Approximately 6% of enrolled learners did SDL.
 - Goal: Improve participation.
- March 2019 (pre-pandemic)
 - Approximately 10% participation.
 - 60% of agencies increased participation rate by 50%.
 - 35% of agencies increased participation rate by 100%.
