Distance learning data: NRS

- NRS tables: 12+ hrs in distance learning
 - 2018-19: 619 participants; 59,413 hours
 - 2019-20: 3711 participants; 368,001 hours
- MSG 2019-20
 - All participants: 28.69%
 - DL participants: 35.14%

Distance learning data: agencies

- 2018-19
 - 39 agencies; 1208 students; 111,570 hours
- 2019-20 Pre-COVID
 - 36 agencies; 1454 students; 97,203 hours
- 2019-20 full year
 - 51 agencies; 8995 students; 807,098 hours
 - 4605 students continued into shutdown period
 - 7 of 10 family literacy only had DL students
 - 29 of 32 AE had 10 or more DL students

Advancing Innovation in Adult Education

- National leadership activity under OCTAE
- Innovative adult education practices that result in outcomes for adult learners
 - New or significantly improved
 - Products (e.g., written curriculum, instructional materials)
 - Services (e.g., provide college and career advising, provide student supports)
 - Processes (e.g., online learning) or way of organizing services (e.g., concurrent enrollment)
